- Choose one non-fiction book to read from the Summer Reading List, write three facts that you have learned from the book, and create a picture of a memorable scene.
- The assignments are due on the first day of school.
- You will share your assignments with your classmates to earn points towards your reading grade!
- Reports will be graded using the attached rubric.

Directions for Non-Fiction Report

1. Use a standard manila file folder. (One has been provided for you.)
2. On the inside front cover (left side) tape or glue your 3 facts you have learned from your book (Format is attached). You may need your parents help to fill in the blanks.
3. On the inside of your folder (right side), create a memorable scene from the book you chose. You may draw or use computer-generated art to create the scene. Provide 1-2 sentences underneath the picture describing the scene and/or why you chose the scene to create.
4. Write your name and the book title on the front cover of the folder.
5. Please do your best work and have fun!

Directions for Fiction Book Report

1. Use a standard manila file folder. (One has been provided for you.)
2. On the inside front cover (left side) tape or glue the completed story map (attached). You may need your parents help to fill in the blanks.
4. On the inside of your folder (right side) create a memorable scene from the book you chose. You may draw or use computer-generated art to create the scene. Provide 1-2 sentences underneath the picture describing the scene and/or why you chose the scene.
5. Write your name and the book title on the front cover of the folder.
