### **Math: 25 Lessons *Simple Solutions: Intermediate B Math***

- Choose and complete 25 lessons from the *Simple Solutions: Intermediate B* book.
- Work must be shown in most of the answer boxes for full credit.
- Rubric: (Worth a total of 75 points)
  - FOR EACH LESSON:
    - 3 Points: All complete, Work in most boxes
    - 2 Points: Half complete, Work in most boxes OR All complete, no work or little work shown
    - 1 Point: Less than half complete OR No work or little work shown
  - Carefully tear out and staple the 25 lessons together. (Make sure you have both the lesson page and the answer page for each.)
  - Make sure your name is at the top of each page
  - All work (Required and Extra Credit) must be handed in on the first day of class.

***\*\*Any additional completed lessons should be stapled together separately from the required 25. Extra credit will be awarded. \*\****

1. Use a standard manila folder. (Typed or neatly handwritten work is acceptable.)
2. On the front cover put your **first and last name on the tab**. Also put the **title of the book and the author's name on the front cover**.
3. Complete the non-fiction book report and attach it to the **inside left cover**.
4. Choose one of the activities below: Use an 8 1/2 x 11 sheet of white unlined paper. Attach your work to the **inside right cover**.
  - A. Create a new book cover design for your book.
  - B. Create a poster that we could use to advertise your book at the next book fair.
5. **On the back cover write a list of 5 questions** that you would like to ask the person that the book was about. These questions should not have already been answered in the book.
